School Meals

Integra, our school meal providers, have reviewed their paid meal pricing and I am writing to advise that the **cost of paid school meal will increase with effect from 1st September by 10 pence to £2.10 per pupil meal.**

Attendance (Term 5)

There is a **clear** correlation between good attendance and good outcomes at school. Children need to be at school in order to learn well. Any child who has **attendance below 95%** is highlighted as a possible concern.

The school will then track attendance over the following term, contact parents

to discuss concerns or call a meeting to offer support and

discuss any possible issues for persistent absence. In severe cases, where the attendance continues to be low, the EWO could be called in to work with the family.

Requests for holidays in term time will not be granted unless there are very exceptional circumstances.

We are very proud of our attendance here at Redfield Edge, thank you for your continued support.

Running Late

We are currently seeing an increase in the number of pupils arriving late to school. The doors open at 8.45am and children need to be in their classes soon after to enable them to take part in their early morning task. **Persistent lateness** can cause disruption to the class and the child involved. It can also mean they are missing out on **important learning** that takes place at the beginning of the school day.
