

Pupil Premium Report July 2019



Spending and Impact Summary

£ 22,000 of pupil premium money was allocated to Redfield Edge Primary School in the financial year 2018-2019. Across the year, Redfield Edge had 204 pupils on roll.

The pupil premium money was spent on four key areas.

- 1. **£10,492** has been allocated to four members of staff who targeted reading recovery across the school.
- 2. £6,819 has been allocated to four members of staff who targeted maths recovery across the school.
- 3. **£3,500** has been allocated to our Family Link worker who works closely with pupils and families supporting with things such as behaviour, home routines, counselling and signposting families to outside agencies.
- 4. **£1,000** has been allocated to teaching assistants delivering preventative services and interventions.
- 5. £500 has been allocated to support FSM/E pupils attend outside learning.

8% of pupils at Redfield Edge Primary School were eligible to receive Pupil Premium during the academic year.

The average % of attendance of non-pupil premium pupils has **lowered slightly this year by 0.47%**. Our Average % of attendance for PP pupils has **increased by 0.73%** with the gap closing from last year to **1.61%**

Our Family link worker and PP leader work closely with families to support them improve attendance with guidance from the Educational Welfare Officer.

The school requested the Local Authority to issue a total of 22 fines to families in the academic year 2018-2019 as a result of poor attendance and unauthorised time out of school.

12.5% (2 pupils) of Pupil Premium pupils finished the year with less than 90% average attendance. One pupil received a longer transition into school due to complex needs. The other pupil received EWO (Education Welfare Officer) intervention and support from school.

When comparing the gaps between PP and Non-PP we are pleased to see an improvement from previous years with individuals. The gaps in the majority of cohorts has closed and in many cases our PP pupils are outperforming our Non PP pupils.

Comparing gaps from year to year proves tricky due to PP children joining school midyear. In 2018-2019, two PP pupils joined us from other local schools. All pupils who meet the criteria for Pupil Premium funding are given the opportunity to receive provision that is extra and different from their peers.

Below is a breakdown of how our Pupil Premium is used in school and the positive impact it has on our pupils.

Pupil Premium Provision 2018 - 2019

Costing and impact

All Pupil Premium children receive small group and/or 1:1 intervention throughout the year. The impact of the provision given is tracked carefully and altered if necessary following discussions at pupil progress meetings.

Many of the pupils receiving reading intervention have reached the top score of the assessment which makes it difficult to measure their full progress since September. 82 % of PP pupils receiving reading assistant intervention made a year or more progress throughout 2018-2019. KS2 exit data shows that 60% of Y6 PP pupils achieved age related expectations, this is a 10% increase on 2017-18. KS1 exit data shows that 50% of pp pupils achieved age related expectations.
				In the other cohorts throughout the school 63% of PP pupils reached age related expectations in their end of year assessments.
Maths Assistant (1:1)	Ongoing each pm	Varies depending on the child	£6,819	During 1:1 tuition session the children are developing their skills in Calculation; rehearsing the four operations and developing confidence, speed and accuracy. Progress is currently measured using arithmetic tests. Test results show good progress being made under timed test conditions. Feedback also demonstrates an improved attitude amongst children when tackling calculation.
				KS1 SAT data shows that 50% of our PP pupils met the age related expectations at the end of Year2.
				In KS2 our 80% of Y6 PP pupils met the age related expectation in maths with 20% achieving Greater Depth.

Counselling sessions with Family link (1:1) Sand tray Therapy	Ongoing 10 week block	½ day per week X2 per week	£1,000	In the other cohorts throughout the school 69% of PP pupils reached age related expectations in their end of year assessments. Our family link worker has worked closely with 5 of our PP pupils to give social and emotional support and to give them opportunities to talk through issues and engage positively with a member of staff. These individual sessions have helped to improve attitude to learning and behaviour. This intervention has given pupils the opportunity to develop skills in expressing emotions and dealing with their anxieties through play. The block of sessions help to improve self-esteem, helps pupils to offload emotional worries and have the

In class support and adult led interventions out of class are having a positive effect on learning and progress. Carefully planned and differentiated support helps to boost confidence and encourage pupils to tackle challenges and work with independence.
				A range of interventions form Smart moves (physical development), Speech and Language support, phonic and spelling groups and problem solving sessions are run on a weekly/bi-weekly basis to tackle gaps in learning and ensure good learning behaviours.
Family Link – parental support	Ongoing	½ day+ per week	Other £1250	Provision Our family link worker has engaged with 8 of our PP families and has worked consistently with them throughout the year. Support offered consists of aiding parents with attendance, financial issues, parenting skills, setting routines at home, liaison with agencies, behaviour and supporting children with their learning. Attendance of PP pupils remains good with average % attendance of 93.94%. The gap between the attendance of PP pupils and Non-PP pupils has lessened this year from 2.8% (2017-18) to 1.61%
Curriculum enrichment	Ongoing		£500	(2018-19). A number of pupils have benefitted from attending class trips / residential holidays along with their peers. These opportunities have positively impacted on both their learning and their social skills.

				Children are encouraged to take part in all aspects of school life.
				32% of PP pupils attended an after school /morning club in 2018 - 2019. This is a decrease from previous years and will need to be a focus for the school moving forward.
