

Learning in Holly Class

Last week the chidren have been exploring our school's Golden Thread Life Skills. Holly Class read the book Pumpkin Soup and looked at the recipe, then practised their cutting and scooping skills to prepare the vegetables to go into the soup which they







Other children in the class really enjoyed digging in their raised beds to find creatures such as worms and slugs. They also found some mushrooms growing, which prompted a discussion about safety, washing our hands and how some mushrooms can be poisonous.

Forest School was a huge success on Monday. Mrs Stone was incredibly impressed with the children's enthusiasm. The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves and their feedback from the session was very positive.

The only negative was that they felt (as did Mrs Stone) that the sessions were too short. Therefore, we are going to spread Forest School out over two afternoons – giving each group of 15 pupils a whole afternoon taking part in outdoor learning activities.

As a school we really value the opportunity for children to learn and develop new skills using our outside environment and therefore believe it is something that needs the appropriate time dedicated to it.



Learning in Willow Class

Year 3 kicked off their new topic this term with a tasting session. The tasting was of different kinds of chocolate and it was very much enjoyed.

The children were not informed of the type and instead had to predict based on appearance and smell. They then tasted the chocolate to confirm their judgement or find otherwise. Some children thought some of the chocolate was lovely, others were not so nice.



Occasionally, an appearance caught them out, such as when the button was mint! This one didn't go down so well. The children also thought of some excellent questions about the new topic to get our 'teeth' into over the next few weeks.

Polite Reminders...
