

In English lessons this week, year 6 have used their drama skills to demonstrate how to use formal language in preparation for their writing activity.










In maths, the children have been multiplying and dividing fractions.

Data below for T1 and T2 We know through research and experience that pupil's with low attendance are more likely to make less progress in their learning. We know high levels of absence effects a child's self -esteem and impacts on their social skills. We know that missing school creates gaps in learning and misconceptions.

For children to learn the **best** they can, they need to be in school every day or ideally with an attendance percentage of no less than 98%

Recently, we have noticed a slight dip in attendance coupled with an increase in term time holiday requests – this has caused some concern.

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be sending home attendance letters to families where attendance has dropped to between 90% - 95%. This is for your information with an offer of support if required.

Those whose attendance has dropped below 90% will receive a phone call to enable the school to gain a better understanding of the context behind the absence and an offer support.

Persistent absence (ongoing concern) will result in the school contacting the Education Welfare Officer requesting them to intervene and work with the family.
