Finally, we will consider how different countries can support each-other, and participate in a fundraising project to support refugees.

History

To kick-start our topic, we will learn what the UK parliament is and how it works. We will then go on to look at the history of inequality for different groups in society (women, ethnic minorities, LGBTQ+). We will learn how key individuals have influenced politics and law over time, and what inequalities and challenges still remain.

Maths

We learn about Hindu beliefs around the universal God, and how different aspects of him are represented in different Hindu Gods and Goddesses.
