Learning in Oak Class

This week we have been exploring our science learning by creating an orrery, which is a model of the Solar System.





We researched and calculated how many times larger or smaller the other planets are than Earth. We found out that some bodies, such as Jupiter and The Sun, are so big that they could fit 1000-1,000,000 Earths inside!





We found that it would not be possible to create an accurate scale, so we made our orreries roughly accurate!

Learning in Maple Class

Maple Class have been exploring how we know so much about the Ancient Greeks. One way we know is through their illustrations of their society of clay pots.

They designed their own Greek Pots exploring the different patterns and shapes found on real Greek pots.





They explored how to manipulate the paint using different tools and refined their ideas to create their final design.

In the coming weeks, they will make actual pots and transfer these designs onto them.

Learning in Willow Class

The weeks keep rattling by in Willow Class. Another week full of learning opportunities!

The children began the week by trying out their own attempts at mummification. They emptied the contents of tomatoes, cleaned/dried them and then filled one of them with salt. They will be observing them each week to see the difference in how the tomatoes change. Some children enjoyed this task much more than others!!







Also in History, the children explored the concept of social classes linked to the Egyptian period. We discussed how there were different roles in society and considered whether there were any similarities or differences with other periods of time we have explored in the past. We also explored the ages of Kings and Queens, considering whether it is right that a person should have the role at such a young age and the problems this might cause.

Finally in PE, the children continued with their Real PE focus of movement, ball skills and dynamic balance before applying this to Tennis.

The children performed songs about The Great Fire of London and performed a dance taking the audience through the story of what happened on the 3rd September 1666.

Learning in Beech Class

In Science we were investigating pitch in string, woodwind and percussion instruments. We observed how the slower the vibration the lower the pitch. In history we were finding place name endings which originate from the Anglo Saxons and plotting them on a map. We learnt the meanings of each place name too.









Nature Explorers

This week, our Year 6's kicked off the new theme for Nature explorers over the next term or so – survival (part 1). The children learnt how to lash wooden sticks together and practised a range of different knots.

They made their own picture frames.



















Secondly, they developed their teamwork and communication by taking part in a sensory trail where they needed to identify different objects and work together to remember them in order.

Unfortunately we lost the match 6-2, however, we have another chance to play Barrs Court next Thursday when we host them here at Redfield Edge.




