Learning in Beech Class

On Monday, the children had the opportunity to taste some unfamiliar fruits. After studying the Jewish New Year festival of Tu B'Shevat when Jews eat plenty of fruit, the children compiled a list that they would like to try.

Learning in Maple Class

In Geography the children have been learning about the different layers of the Rainforest. They created their own Rainforest Biones in a jar – demonstrating their knowledge from their learning. Well done Maple Class!

Learning in Willow Class

Amazing art has continued in Willow Class this week, the children explored some artwork by artist Andy Warhol and used this to influence their own prints.

They designed and engraved onto a foam print and considered which colours they wanted to use. They used paint and rolled the print to transfer the pattern.



They showed fantastic resilience if the print didn't go as planned and thought about what they needed to do to improve it.

The children also developed their use of technology to show data. They inputted data into a spreadsheet and created their own charts too. Fantastic computing and maths work!

Finally in music, the children have also been using technology to compose their own music. Using Chrome music lab, they enjoyed composing their own tunes and accompanying lyrics. Very impressive.
