









# Communication and Language

Use new vocabulary in different contexts. Engage in non-fiction books. Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important. Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding. Retell the story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text; some as exact repetition and some in their own words.

Familiar tales – Billy Goats and Goldilocks.

Books about gardening and planting.

Books about baby chicks and lifecycles.

## **Expressive Arts and Design**

Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody. • Develop storylines in their pretend play. • Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.

## Physical Development.

Revise and refine the fundamental movement skills they have already acquired: rolling, crawling, walking, jumping, running, hopping, skipping, and climbing. Progress towards a more fluent style of moving, with developing control and grace.

Develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Suggested tools: pencils for drawing and writing, paintbrushes, scissors, knives, forks and spoons.
