We will be holding our annual sports day on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June – weather permitting. Please look out for the Parent Mail with full details.

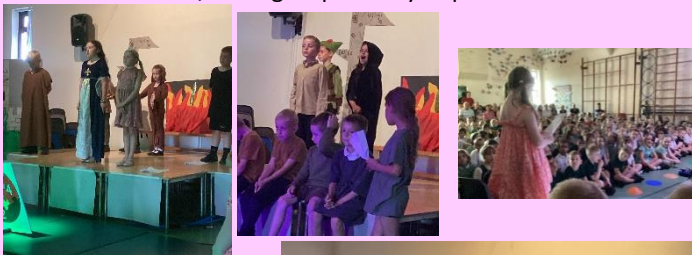


# Parent Coffee Afternoon with a focus on Dyslexia
