### Learning in Willow Class Class Trip to Bristol Museum

The children in Willow Class enjoyed a lovely trip to Bristol Museum on Tuesday. They took part in an Ancient Egyptian workshop, exploring both real and replica artefacts, discussing what each item was and how it was used. They were encouraged to use their oracy skills and I heard lots of 'inviting in' and 'build or challenges'.









In groups, the children explored the rest of the museum and did so impeccably. With adults, the children explored the exhibits, had some good discussions and ticked off their checklists they had been given prior to the visit. It was a day thoroughly enjoyed by all.



#### **Visit from Artist Matt Jean**

Matt led an assembly for the whole school and spoke about the work he had done as an artist. He showed some of his work which really surprised the children – 'art can be a job!'

In Holly Class, the artists the children looked at all linked together. The children read 'The Dot' and explored what 'dots' looked like and how to create these. This led to learning about the artist Kandinsky and how he used round shapes concentrically. Then we created an abstract collaborative piece about Bristol, using the techniques by Kate Elkington and her abstract, expressive mark making.











To start arts week, <u>Hazel Class</u> looked at famous printing artist Andy Warhol. They annotated his work, discussing likes and dislikes. Throughout the rest of the day the children experimented a range of printing techniques including overlapping and rotating. They used their hands, foam and plasticine to produce a row of colourful Bristol homes above the river Avon.



During Art Week, <u>Pine Class</u> learnt so many new skills and had an absolutely wonderful time getting creative!

Firstly, the children focused on an artist named Mary Price. She is a local artist who designed one of the unicorns in Bristol. Her design is in Cheddar! The children recreated the unicorn using Modroc and then had our very own artist, Jayne Dean to finish off the final touches! Doesn't it look great?!

Pine Class also created a landscape mixing different coloured acrylic paint and using different shapes in the same way Mary Price has in her artwork.

The children were also inspired by a French pointillism artist, Georges Seurat who uses small dots to create realistic paintings.

They brought in their own pictures of their families and recreated these using the pointillism technique.



Over the course of Art week, <u>Willow class</u> have used a vast range of skills in drawing, painting, printing and the use of textiles.

The children have created some lovely individual pieces using the Harbour side as a stimulus, whilst their collaborative piece is closely linked to the work of the local artist Farrah Fortnam. Using similar styles and colours, the children each created their own art based on the artists unicorn, the 'Guardian of the Ocean'

Finally, the children used textiles to create their own mini cushions. They designed, cut and stitched the different elements and were really pleased with their outcomes.



What an Art week, Beech class had! The children enjoyed learning about various artists and practising their skill in our own art work. The children created weaving, sewing, montage as well as a 3D collaborative piece. The results are amazing and we can't wait to show you at the art gallery!


