

In January, for our INSET training, staff attended an online seminar with Berkley Wilde – Founder and Chief Executive of The Diversity Trust.



Berkeley explored the key themes of Equality, Diversity, Inclusion and Belonging (EDIB) as well as equalities legislation, some of the barriers faced by equalities communities and helped us to reflect together as staff of a new, upcoming Multi Academy Trust.

Learning in Holly Class

Then, we did some sequencing of the process before finally having a go at writing our own instructions. The children did well.

Learning in Pine class

This week Pine Class have kicked off their Great Fire of London topic!

The children have been performing poetry in English and even shared this to the rest of the school in celebration assembly. In Art, Year 2 looked at the artist Lieve Verschuier's painting that represents the fire that spread across London. The children then annotated the painting with their likes and dislikes.





The class then had a go at some continuous line drawing inspired by a crackling fire on the interactive board and used colours that reflected a fire scene.





We have absolutely loved our DT topic this term making cars! From researching cars, designing our own and learning the individual parts of a car. We then got creative with paint and learning how to use a saw to create our axels. Finally, we decorated our wheels and added the finishing touches. It has been amazing! 🚓 🚗


