Following our observations, we have contacted parents individually by email if we believed their parking to be unsafe in an effort to improve the situation for everyone.



We should not be:

- mounting the kerb when parking as this narrows the pathway for pedestrians.
- parking on the bus stop
- parking on private property (opposite the school field)
- parking on any zig-zag markings
- using the school drive/car park

If everybody adhered to these principles, the road would be safer for all.

I know it is incredibly frustrating when trying to find appropriate parking at busy times however the children's safety must come first.
