
### 'The Wild'

The children began the day exploring the book's message and looking closely at the incredible illustrations.

The children watched a video of the author being interviewed and took part in some hot seating.

Throughout the day, the children created their very own collage with printing elements inspired by the illustrations in the book.

Finally, the children wrote their own Kenning poems about the animal they chose for their collage.









### Learning in Maple Class

### 'The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse'

In the morning Year 5 took part in a reading lesson, introducing the text. They made initial predictions and asked questions about the front cover. Then the class explored the

language and vocabulary used throughout the book.

The children then looked at a specific part of the book where the characters are discussing the wild and the children wrote setting descriptions, exploring how to show/describe emotion and atmosphere through setting description and speech. At the end of the morning, the children had an Oracy/PSHE lesson.

In art, the children were inspired by the different lands (from different fairytales) dotted throughout the book. The children then used their imagination to create an imaginative world and characters based on the book.













### **Learning in Pine Class**

### 'Here we are'.

In Year 2 the children focused on Miss Kelly's favourite author - Oliver Jeffers!

They have already read lots of his books in

Year 1 and this year they focused on 'Here we Are'. The book has an important message about how special our planet is and making sure we spend the time doing what we love.



The children wrote instructions for an Alien who was visiting our planet for the first time. In the afternoon Year 2 created planets using pointillism and finished the day being 'mystery readers' for Holly Class. Each child chose their own book to share with the youngest children in our school. They loved this responsibility!

### 'Abomination'

Year 6 have been looking at this text in detail over the term so far. They chose to continue working with it for World Book Day in order to explore the characters a little further.

The children predicted what their character 'Abomination', from their class book would look like. They used evidence from what they have read so far to draw conclusions. They then wrote about what it would be like to meet the creature.


