Learning in Holly Class

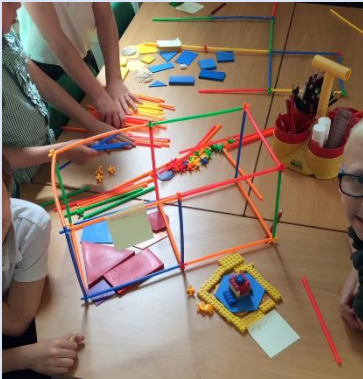

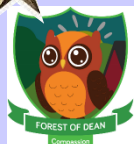

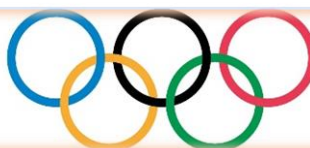
