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#### A week off timetable studying diverse cultures and experiencing a range of different sports!

Sports day will take place on the Tuesday of this week (weather permitting). This year, due to it also being Olympic week, sports day will look a little different.

Both KS1 and KS2 classes will compete in the afternoon in a range of track events. This will begin at 1pm and finish at 3.30pm. Parents will be invited to come along and cheer on their children.
