 Challenge and support to senior leaders, so that the effective deployment of staff and resources, including the pupil premium, service premium and special educational needs funding, secures strong provision and outcomes for all children.

- Seeking to maintain a deep, accurate understanding of the academy's effectiveness informed by the views of children, community, and staff.

- Challenging senior leaders to ensure that there is a culture of safeguarding and that systems and processes within this are highly effective.
