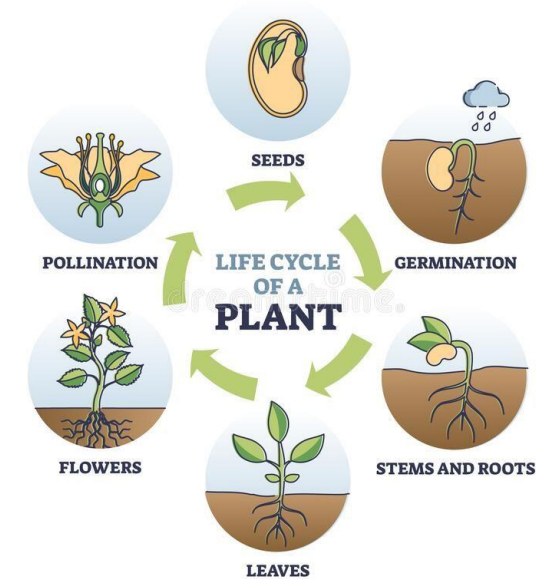


Term 5- Green Fingers- How does your garden grow?

<i>deciduous</i>	A tree that loses its leaves throughout the Autumn season.
<i>evergreen</i>	A tree that retains leaves all year round.

Did you know ...?

A wild plant seed grows where it falls. It doesn't need to be planted or cared for as it grows.

A garden plant is a plant people choose to grow in their garden and it needs to be cared for as it grows.

Did you know ...?

The leaves of a tree are green most of the time, but they can come in many colours, shapes and sizes. The leaves take in sunlight and use water and food from the roots to make the tree grow, and to reproduce.
