

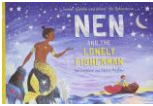
What are Pine Class learning in Term 6?



English

Fiction- Nen and the lonely fisherman. Children will revisit using expanded noun phrases, spelling and editing words with suffixes and subordinating conjunctions to extend their sentences. Children will re write the story from Ernest's perspective.

Poetry- Seaside poems, children create their own poetry based on the seaside.



Science

To work scientifically to record and gather a range of data to answer questions through simple tests.

How can we look after the seaside? (Global)

Which material would make the best boat?

Which material would be best to make a wind turbine?

Maths

Time: differentiate between the minute and hour hand. Learn to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes past and to the clock.

Statistics- Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables.

Geometry- Use mathematic vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement.

Islam- Does completing Hajj make a person a better Muslim? (Community)

Changing Me (Life Skills)

Computing

Data Handling, Programming and E-Safety.

Geography/History

To use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to human and physical features, to use aerial photographs and to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

Music

Sea shanties- children learn and perform a range of sea shanties.
