




#### **Learning in Beech Class**

Following on from their amazing class assembly, Beech class are thoroughly enjoying their 'Electricity' themed learning. They have been busy building circuits with squeals of excitement across the classroom when the bulb lights or the buzzer buzzes!



They have investigated complete and incomplete circuits, making predictions about which circuits will work and then testing their theories, adapting and improving circuits as they work. They understand that in order for the circuit to work effectively, the electricity must be able to flow out of one terminal of the battery, around the circuit and then back to the other battery terminal in a continual loop.
