The children performed so well with excellent singing and confident narrators. Everyone was able to be in the right place at the right time and both performances were great to watch!






A HUGE well done to all of the children who learnt lines, practised songs, sat beautifully, and joined in with the show. All of the staff were very proud of you! ©

# **Oak Class Christmas Fayre**


