5 and 6.








The children had a range of different options for main meals, vegetarian, and deserts. They had to work together to discuss


### **Online Pupil Survey**

#### **Class Assemblies**

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#### **Learning in Pine Class**

This week Pine class have been getting scientific and conducting some of their own investigations in groups!

On Wednesday, the children were exploring materials and how some objects can change shape by being squished, rolled, bent, or stretched. Year 2 used a range of objects including playdough, pipe cleaners, tin cans and more to find out how materials are different.





This afternoon Miss Kelly set the children a challenge to melt their ice cubes the quickest. The children could choose from salt, warm water, sugar or heat to melt the cubes and find out which worked. The children loved getting messy!





## **Learning in Oak Class**

This week, Year 6 built on their learning about how light is refracted from last week. The children discovered that when light is refracted, each individual wavelength of light is separated, creating a rainbow effect.









Oak Class also investigated the Spanish Armada, and how Sir Francis Drake led his ships to defeat the Spanish and prevent an invasion. This led to England, and latterly Britain, becoming a powerful sea-faring nation.

#### **Learning in Beech Class**

Year 4 have been using their shield designs to make prototype Roman shields in
