Learning in Maple class

Last week, in Maple class, the children began to make discoveries related to their new term topic – Rainforests. They compared the temperate regions of Europe to the tropical equator, looking specifically at the Amazon rainforest.



The children then learned about the tropics of Cancer and Capricorn and how the weather there is much the same year round. They created maps to display where in the world rainforests are found and how to draw accurately.

In Science, Maple Class have been building on their knowledge from KS1 about parts of a flower and they explored the garden and school grounds using magnifying glasses to identify parts.
