Communication and Language

- Listening to familiar stories and answering what, where, why, how questions
- Following instructions and directions
- Tuning into rhyme and rhythm within words and stories
- Deconstructed role play inside and out with 'oracy hotspots'
- Listening to one another adults to model waiting turn to speak, looking at speaker and listening.

Maths


- Matching objects
- Subitising 1-3 (Knowing 3 is 3 without counting)
- Sorting objects
- Making simple patterns
- Continuous provision loose parts including conkers, corks, shells, gems; Numicon; counting animals; dominoes, etc

Expressive Arts and Design

- Continuous provision area getting to know our classroom: painting, cutting and collage
 - Playing a range of musical instruments and expressing ourselves to different genres of music, tapping out rhythms and beats.
- Singing familiar songs and making up dances.
- Using charcoal and other forms of media to create representations of our families for display

Physical Development.

- Weekly Trim Trail access & 'Wheely Wednesday Sessions – Scooters, Trikes etc.
- Using the outside space, large tyres to move and build with, planks to balance on.
- Fine Motor activities within continuous provision (Mountain Challenges) with threading, pegs, tweezers etc
- Pen grip assessments and planning targeted interventions.

- What makes me, me?

Personal Social Emotional Development

- Making new relationships with children and adults
- Jigsaw (PSHE) lessons weekly

- Expressing Feelings introducing the Zones of Regulation Conflict

Literacy

- Beginning discrete phonics sessions Rocket Phonics scheme: s, a, t, p, i,
- Writing for a purpose; labelling environment, writing messages and post cards.
- Introducing 'The Message Centre', Chalking on large boards, writing on large floor paper, writing recipes in our 'Mud Kitchen' outside. Encouraging mark making in outside areas.
