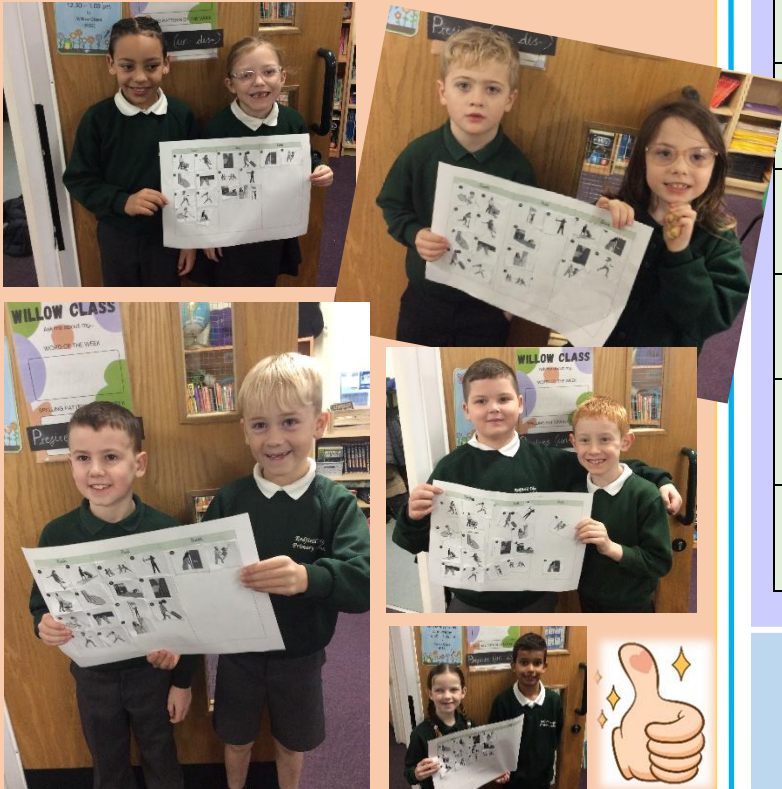

Year 2 have finished their shape unit of learning in maths this week. They have learned how to sort 3D shapes using their properties – edges, vertices and faces.

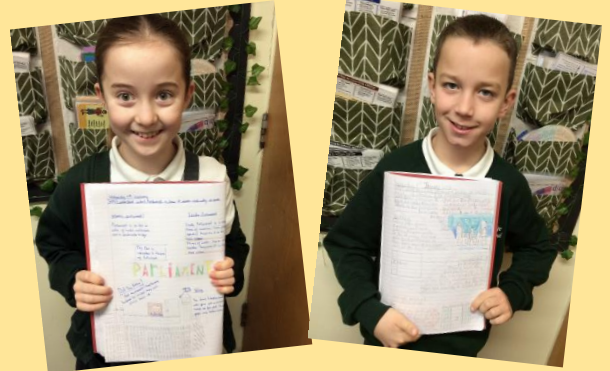

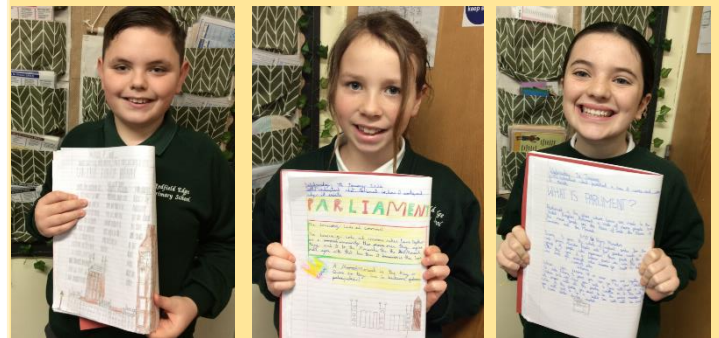
Learning in Maple Class
