Little people big dreams: Amelia Earhart and Emma Jane's aeroplane

Narrative outcome: retelling (Emma Jane's aeroplane)

Non-fiction outcome: writing to inform-Report (Little people big dreams: Amelia Earhart)

Maths

Shape continued

Identify 3D shapes and count vertices, edges and faces. Categorise 3D shapes by features

Money

Recognise and count a range of coins (pence and pounds) calculate with money (including notes)

Multiplication and Division

Recognise multiplication as repeated addition and division as repeated subtraction. Eg 2×4 is the same as $2 + 2 + 2 + 2$.

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers.

Geography

Locational knowledge

Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans
Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the UK and its surrounding seas

Place knowledge

Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of Bristol and Brazil.

Human and physical geography

Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles

Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans

Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map.
