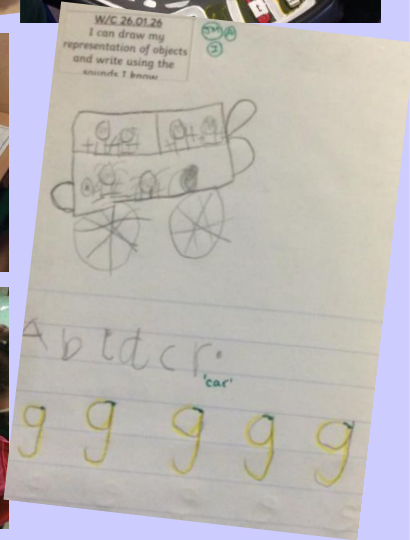

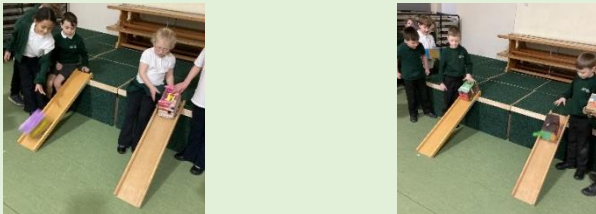


Learning in Pine Class

Pine class have finished their DT project, designing cars for their favourite book characters. After painting them, the children were able to use their plans to add the finishing touches. Some of them added windows and doors!



Extra details were added using pens and paint and some of the children even created a string/handle to be able to manually pull their cars along. Year 2 decided to test their cars and how well the axels worked. They used the ramp previously used in science and then evaluated their cars thinking about what they would do differently - such as shortening the axels or securing the wheels using a stronger material so they weren't so wobbly!



The children's creations looked absolutely brilliant and the whole class enjoyed making them!
