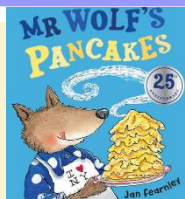

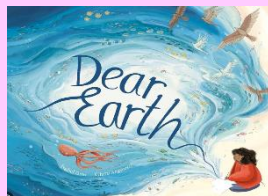
The children listened to the story lots of times, joining in with key parts, as well as learning about writing a list and following instructions!

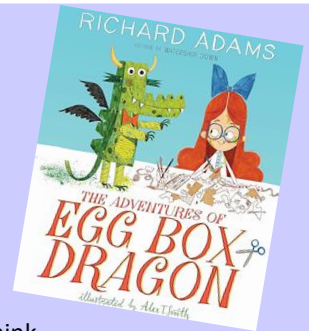
Well done Willow Class, you looked fantastic!

This mischievous character, with a special ability to find lost things, inspired the children to write their own stories.

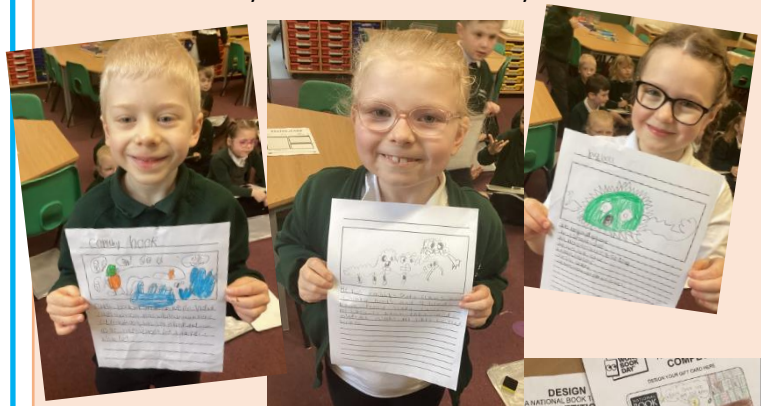
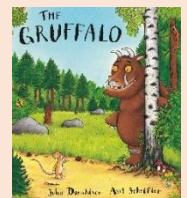
Year 1 used their imaginations to think about what they would do if they found a dragon egg, learned how to draw a dragon and even made their own dragons to take home.

Father Malcolm is our Mosaic Chaplain who supports all 12 schools in a number of ways including supporting staff with the teaching of the RE curriculum.

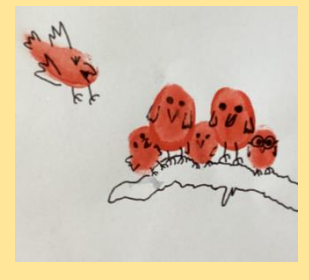
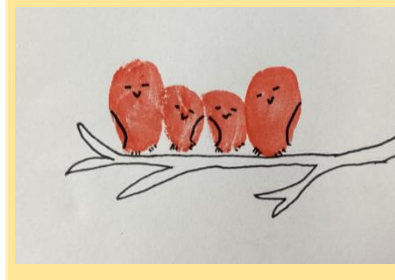
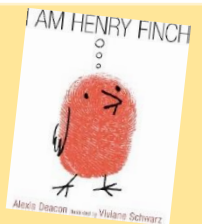


Each term, Father Malcom will visit Redfield Edge to touch base with the staff and next time, he will teacher an RE lesson in some of our classes which I know the children will love.

On a **Tuesday**, due to Mrs Walker and Mrs Jones leading Gardening club, the office will **close at 3.30pm** until further notice. 😊

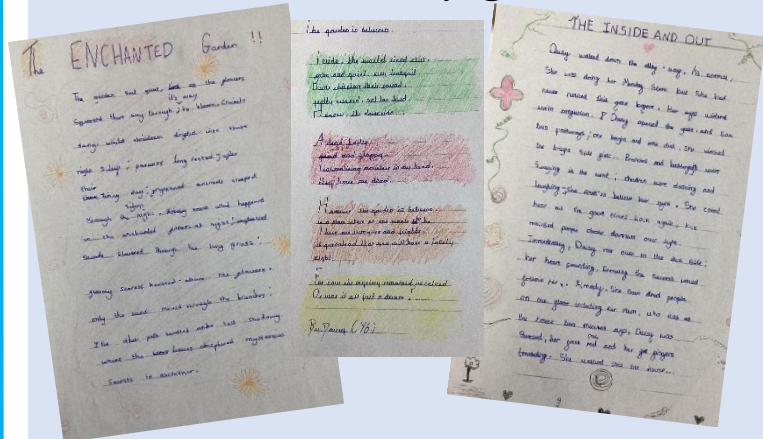
