



Redfield Edge Primary School School Uniform Policy



At Redfield Edge Primary School, we actively encourage the wearing of school uniform throughout the school day. This promotes a sense of unity, reduces peer pressure, and aids in the monitoring and identification of children, particularly when off the school premises. The school uniform policy is designed to be inclusive and respectful of all children, regardless of gender.

Uniform Guidelines

Children may wear any of the following items, with modifications based on seasonal changes and personal preferences. The policy allows for flexibility where required by religious doctrine or cultural considerations. Reasonable adjustments will be made for those children with special educational needs in consultation with the school.

Winter Uniform

- Dark grey or black trousers
- Dark grey or black skirt, pinafore dress, or tailored trousers
- Plain white school shirt or white short-sleeved polo shirt
- Plain bottle green short sleeved polo shirt
- Plain bottle green jumper, sweatshirt, or cardigan
- Bottle green school sweatshirt or cardigan
- White, black, grey, or bottle green socks
- Appropriate footwear (wholly or mainly black, not studded)
- waterproofs and wellington boots for Nature Explorers

Summer Uniform

In addition to the winter uniform, during the summer months, children may wear:

- Dark grey or black shorts (not sports shorts)
- Green and white gingham or striped school dress (optional)

Physical Education (PE)

Children should wear suitable clothing for each physical activity. PE attire should be practical and comfortable for movement.

- Plain black shorts or leggings
- House colour school PE T-shirt
- Black daps or trainers (depending on the activity)
- Suitable dark tracksuits for colder weather
- Dark sweatshirt or hoodie for colder weather
- Spare socks
- All items should be named and stored in a named PE bag

Swimming

- Appropriate swimming trunks (not shorts) or a one-piece swimming costume
- Towel
- All items should be named

Uniform Rules

Children may wear:

1. Sensible wristwatches (marked with the owner's name). The pupil is responsible for their watch, as the school is not liable for damage or loss of personal property
2. Hairbands and scrunchies in school colours. Children should avoid wearing fancy hairbands that may pose safety risks

Children should **NOT** wear:

1. Jewellery, except for stud earrings (which must be removed for sports activities or covered with a plaster or micropore, which should be provided from home)
2. Additional unnecessary accessories, badges, large bows...etc
3. Make-up or nail varnish
4. Sports branded clothing during the regular school day
5. High-heeled shoes or crocs (on health and safety grounds)
6. Hats and scarves during lessons, unless for religious or medical reasons

Children do not need to bring a pencil case to school, we supply all stationary needed throughout the school day. Bags containing reading books and lunchboxes should be **small** to allow it to fit on a peg within our small cloakroom areas.
