English

Class Read: *The Jamie Drake Equation*
English Text Focus: *The Phone Booth in Mr Hirota's Garden*

New scene: write a new scene for the middle of the story, developing Makio & Mr Hirota's characters through dialogue

Sequel: Mr Hirota and Makio travel to the next town and build a phone booth for the local community.

Writing to Explain: Instructions (Formal): Tsunami survival guide

Writing to Inform: News bulletin: Phonebooth duo strike again! (Links to the sequel)

Skills: Active and passive voice, split speech, use dialogue to advance the action, language of comparison and contrast

Introduce English focus: Alma (Literacy Shed)


Retelling: Rewrite the whole narrative and continue the story to include dialogue between Alma and a doll next to her on the shelf.

Earth and Space

Describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system
Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth
Describe the Sun, Earth and Moon as approximately spherical bodies
Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky.
