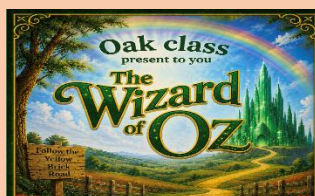

Farewell Miss Kelly

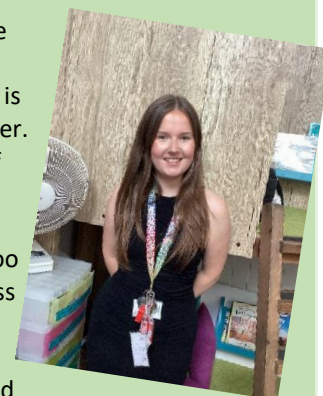
For the next academic year, Miss Kelly will be working with one of our Trust schools as their SENDCO as she finishes her training.
